Mr Lake was an outdoor man, a keen gardener, and

enjoyed walking.

Mr Lake was a staunch churchgoer and had been both a churchwarden and treasurer of the parochial church council in

Ingoldisthorpe.

The former rector of Ingoldisthorpe, Canon Roger Pott, came out of retirement especially to take the service. Mr Eric Bocking was the

organist.
